Chinese 4194. Group Studies

Conversational Cantonese for Mandarin Speakers

Are you interested in learning Cantonese? It is spoken by about 100 million people in the world, notably in the provinces of Guangdong and Guangxi in southern China, as well as in Hong Kong, Macau, and in overseas communities, including in Chinatowns and other communities in North America. This fall, for the very first time, Ohio State is offering Cantonese: **Conversational Cantonese for Mandarin Speakers** (Chinese 4194)! This language course is for students who already can speak Mandarin Chinese and would like to learn to converse in Cantonese as well.

Course description:	This course is for students who would like to learn to converse in Cantonese, and is open to both native speakers and advanced learners of Mandarin Chinese. The course focuses on developing students' speaking and listening skills to enable them to function in everyday, Cantonese-speaking environments. Classes are conducted in Cantonese with grading based on daily performance.
